

Privacy Statement

Articles 15 and 16 of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 of the European Parliament and the Council of 23 October 2018 apply to the processing of personal data carried out by the European Parliament.

- 1) Who processes your personal data?
 - The European Parliament, is acting as the controller¹ and the entity responsible for the processing is the Events and Exhibitions Unit, represented by Head of Unit.

- 2) What is the purpose of the processing of your personal data?
 - Your personal data will be processed in order to select the winner who would announce the LUX Prize Audience Mention.

- 3) What is the legal basis for the processing?
 - The decision of the Bureau as of 3 April 2006 (PE 371.152/BUR) and the Bureau Working Party on Information and Communication of the European Parliament held on 24 April 2012 (PE 488.141/BUR/GT).

- 4) What personal data is processed?
 - We collect only your email address or Facebook ID, which is a simple numeric value without any further information and for which of the three LUX films you have voted.

- 5) How will your personal data be processed?
 - E-mail address or Facebook ID along with a vote are processed . The purpose of the processing is to select one person to announce the winner of the Audience Mention.

- 6) For how long will your personal data be stored?

Your personal data will be stored until the next Karlovy Vary International Film Festival ends which is beginning July where the announcement of the Audience Mention takes place,. After this period (i.e. approximately 10 months) your data will be erased.

- 7) Who are the recipients of your personal data?
 - There are no other recipients of your personal data.

¹ A Controller the public authority, agency or other body which, alone or jointly with others, determines the purposes and means of the processing of the personal data. The controller is represented by the head of the entity.

- 8) Will your personal data be shared with a non-EU country or international organisation?
- No, your personal data will not be shared or transferred to a non-EU country or any international organisation.
- 9) Are any automated processes² and/or profiling³ used to make decisions which could affect you?
- Not applicable.
- 10) If personal data have not been obtained from you, what is their source?

- 11) What rights do you have?
- You have the following rights:
 - Right to rectification of your personal data.
 - Right to erasure of your personal data.
 - Right to withdraw your consent at any time, without affecting the lawfulness of processing based on consent before its withdrawal.

² Making a decision solely by automated means and without any human involvement. {Theoretical Examples: internet page where selecting certain options will automatically place you in different mailing lists where you are sent the corresponding monthly newsletter / using an automated system to mark "Multiple Choice" test answers and assign a pass mark according to the number of correct answers}.

³ Profiling analyses aspects of an individual's personality, behaviour, interests and habits to make predictions or decisions about them. Used to analyse or predict aspects concerning the data subject's performance at work, economic situation, health, personal preferences or interests, reliability or behaviour, location or movements, etc. {Theoretical Example: when using social media tools data is collected and your trends registered. This data is then used to form new/different predictions on you.}
